- 2. SK BANSKA01: The receiving Institution will send its decision within 2 weeks.
 - F PARISO04: The receiving institution will send its decision within 5 weeks.
- 3. SK BANSKA01: A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]

F PARISO04: A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.

4. Termination of the agreement

[It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination

clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."]

1. Grading systems of the institutions

At Paris-Sorbonne University, all our marks are out of 20. For information, Paris-Sorbonne stands amongst one the most difficult grading systems in France. It is important to notice that a 10/20 is a good grade, and that it stands for the passing grade.

The credit part refers to the number of European credits the course provides. It is based on the 30 credits per semester system that French students must pass to validate one semester. It does not refer to the number of hours taken for one course. The local grade (/20) is the most relevant information you should consider to validate your students' semester/year at Paris-Sorbonne.

Please note that when local grade is "attended" or "enrolled", it means that your student attended the class and provide the necessary work for it, but did not take any exams.
